Welcome to the April e-bulletin about our work together to evangelise our diocese in the context of our **Vision Document: Shaping Our Future**.

Parish Partnerships are already achieving great things. I just heard that one is now bringing all the PPCs together to get to know each other and share ideas, another has established a caritas project to work on as a partnership, two have renamed themselves. What is in a name you might ask; well in some cases a very great deal and it shows a solidarity in a mutually shared future. Other partnerships have already begun the process of implementing new Mass schedules in a co-ordinated manner that should benefit priests and people. Bishop Alan has already given approval to the change. Another three partnerships (at least) are exploring possibilities for their combined buildings conscious that once they start to work as a partnership they can find better uses for some of them. Staff and Trustees of our diocese are working with them to help the process. I know of a couple of prayer groups that have been formed across the partnership. Priests have been meeting to consider their future in the context of the new partnerships and you will see much that is new in this ebulletin. Please take advantage of the things on offer. Change is not always welcomed but it often proves to be an exciting time when new possibilities are found and new ways to serve God come about. There's a lot of good stuff going on. Thank you.

Vocations: Recently, Michael one of our seminarians, shared that he has been accepted for candidacy for ordination to the priesthood. This is a significant milestone on his vocation journey and our thanks and congratulations go to him and all men in this position. Bishop Alan has previously noted that our work on Parish Partnerships is work on the environment which newly ordained priests will step into. While we owe it to everyone in our church to ensure that we create the best environment that we can, let us never forget that these men have answered God's call and that they will work with us and for us in this new environment. Our work together to evangelise our diocese is not a mere hypothetical exercise; it is serious preparation for a new shared future. Our continued prayers go with all our seminarians and our work together holds them in mind.
