Cathedral Parish

Sitting in the heart of our diocese, the Cathedral has a special character and role that it is keen to develop. Our Cathedral plays host to many diocesan and civic events each year. Youth, Ordinariate, Canons and Chrism Masses as well as many musical events and the annual Citizenship Awards to name a few. Partly as a result of the civic role and partly as a result of the large number of baptisms, funerals, weddings, First Holy Communion and Confirmation groups, our Cathedral comes into contact with many relatively "unchurched" people. It is keen to recognise the unique opportunity to share graced moments to make the Risen Christ real to those attending such events. It strives to celebrate the liturgy with reverence, joy and a true "noble simplicity" so that Christ is encountered in His Church and seen with a renewed clarity.

The Cathedral is asking itself questions that we can all ask of our own churches: How do we meet "unchurched" people who enter into the precincts of grace, how do we speak to them and help them to sense God's love for them?

The newly formed Love in Action group is committed to find practical ways to engage people in the Social Teaching of the Church through two projects, one looking at our Common Home and the other at Loneliness. Starting on Friday 4th October and continuing every first Friday of the month, the doors of the parish hall will be opened between 1pm and 3pm for all people (parishioners or not) to be invited in. They have also set up two groups for married couples and millennials and they will be supporting the God who speaks initiative with a series of Lenten Lectures. Our Cathedral parish is committed to being a channel of God's grace for the whole of our diocese and we pray for their continuing mission. Thank you.
