NOTES:

- 1. Baptism is to be administered only if the person is unbaptised; if there is prudent doubt as to the fact or validity of baptism, it may be administered conditionally, and with appropriate explanation to those present.
- 2. Admission to the sacraments of initiation is to be recorded in the Registers of Baptism or Reception of Baptised Adults, and of Confirmation; where the candidate has been married prior to admission, this fact is also to be noted (unless the bond has been dissolved by death or a declaration of nullity).
- 3. <u>Baptised Catholics:</u> no faculty is required unless they have formally abjured their faith, or joined another Church or religion; however, they may NOT be confirmed unless the Bishop has given a special faculty in an individual case.
- 4. <u>Children:</u> for those under 7 years, no formal ceremony is required, but it is advisable to enter the details of baptism in the Register at the time of First Communion, for future record; for those between 7 & 14, no legal faculty is required from the Bishop/Chancery, but the RCIA is obligatory in the special form provided for this age group (found in Part II 'Rites for Particular Circumstances' 'Receiving of Children').
