Is staff wellbeing a regular agenda item at your full governing body meeting? The Diocese of Brentwood has a model policy on staff wellbeing you can use or adapt.

Education Support Partnership has a free helpline for staff which includes 24/7 telephone support

DfE have introduced a period product scheme to provide free period products for learners under the age of 19 who need them. <u>This guidance contains information on choosing and ordering period products</u>, distributing products within school and tackling stigma

Did you know that the Diocese has a service level agreement with <u>Teaching Personnel</u> entitling Diocesan schools to access a preferential rate on recruitment and supply staff?

The new Ofsted framework has a strong focus on the curriculum. How well can you explain the <u>intent, implementation and impact of your school's curriculum</u> and how it is sequenced?
