DFE has published guidance to assist schools in providing advice regarding the novel coronavirus COVID-19 Schools should not close in response to a suspected (or confirmed) COVID-19 case unless directed to do so by Public Health England

The Diocese of Brentwood has developed a <u>Protocol for Catholic Multi Academy Trusts</u> which strongly encourages no change in teachers' pay and conditions when converting to academy status

Book your place at the spring term Chairs' Network meeting on Monday 30 March (6:00-7:30) The focus will be on Admissions and Appeals, led by Theresa Kerr from Winckworth Sherwood Law. This is a valuable opportunity for chairs and vice chairs to meet once a term, networking and sharing good practice whilst discussing a range of relevant issues with presenting professionals

Children who spend a lot of time sitting still are more likely to develop depression by the age of 18 according to a study by researchers at University College London

DfE is seeking views on proposed changes from September 2020 to the statutory guidance Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE). The consultation closes on 21 April 2020

From September 2020, all new primary school pupils will take the reception baseline assessment (RBA). This teacher-led check will pave the way for the removal of SATs in year 2 from 2022/23

Has your governing body reviewed the school's IDSR report? This <u>guidance gives an overview of the inspection data summary report (IDSR)</u> for primary and secondary schools, along with information to help interpret the charts

The new Diocesan online learning APP for governors is ready for launch and <u>chairs have</u> <u>been asked to nominate 5 foundation governors to take part</u> in the first tranche. A further 5 free licences will be made available to each school in the next academic year

Improving discipline is one of the government's key priorities and DfE have launched the behaviour hubs programme, open to schools who have received an Ofsted 'requires improvement' judgement but based on need. The programme is based on Tom Bennett's independent review of behaviour in schools creating a culture: how school leaders can optimise behaviour
