BIG QUESTION: Who are my brothers and sisters?



St Francis of Assisi called all God's creatures his brothers and sisters. In "Canticle of the Sun," Saint Francis of Assisi praises God for some of the wonders of the world. St Francis believed that everything in the natural world was a gift from God and, as such, deserved to be appreciated and valued. Because of this, St Francis refers to the sun, wind, air, and fire as his brothers, and to the moon, stars, earth and water as his sisters.

BIG QUESTION: How can we build a community of peace?

To be a community of peace, we must follow Jesus' example to love one another.

Jesus said, "Love one another as I have loved you." (John 13:30)

Jesus is the Prince of Peace. He said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." (John 14:27)

Jesus tells us about the peace of God who loves everyone equally. God has no favourites. God wants everyone to be treated fairly.
