Rights and Responsibilities

BIG QUESTION: What are my responsibilities?

The story of Cain and Abel Adam and Eve had two sons, their first son was called Cain and their second was called Abel. Cain was a farmer and Abel was a shepherd. Cain and Abel were like most siblings—they didn't always get along. But they were brothers who loved each other very much, despite their occasional fights. Their parents, Adam and Eve told Cain and Abel that God had given them a message to sacrifice a lamb to show God how sorry they were for their sins. He looked around and sighed a breath of relief that no one was nearby. And then the Lord spoke and said, "Cain where is your brother?" Cain shrugged and said "I don't know. **Am I my brother's keeper?**" God replied "Cain, how could you be so cruel to your only brother? He has done nothing but try his best for me, for his parents and for you." Cain fell to the ground sobbing. Finally he felt the horror of what he had done and he had to live with that feeling and the knowledge that he had killed his brother for the rest of his life.

Yes we are! Jesus commanded us to Love one another (John 13:34-35)




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BIG QUESTION: What are all our responsibilities?

6. We are to be “submitting to one another” (Ephesians 5:21)
7. We are to “Consider one another” (Hebrews 10:24-25)
8. We are to be “hospitable to one another” (1Peter 4:8-10)
