Governor News – May 2021

This is a monthly summary to help governors keep up to date with key themes of national education policy, the local Diocesan context, research and good practice.

Pupils will have made learning losses, as well as gains, during lockdowns and robust teacher assessment will be crucial in supporting recovery plans. For example, there is growing evidence that the past year of lockdowns has had an impact on young children's language skills. Has your governing body discussed the school's recovery plan?

Ofsted have <u>updated the Education Inspection Framework (EIF)</u> with minor amendments to 'reflect the COVID-19 context that education providers are operating in and the disruption the pandemic has caused to them.' The <u>revised School Inspection Handbook</u> can be found here

The <u>summer term CMAT News</u>, which shares information about MATs and academies across the Diocese of Brentwood, is now available

DfE has published guidance on what schools and students need to know about the arrangements for awarding GCSEs, AS and A levels, VTQs and other qualifications in summer 2021

<u>Following the cancellation of statutory national curriculum assessments due to be held in</u> <u>summer 2021 at key stage 1 and key stage 2</u>, DfE will not be publishing any national, regional, local or constituency statistics for any primary school assessments for the 2020 to 2021 academic year

<u>BDES has developed a model Induction checklist</u> which gives examples of the key information and support that new governors in our Catholic schools should receive. Please feel free to adapt the checklist to meet the needs of your own governing board
