## Governor News – September 2021

This is a monthly summary to help governors keep up to date with key themes of national education policy, the local Diocesan context, research and good practice.

DfE has <u>updated guidance for schools during coronavirus</u> as well as <u>Contingency</u> <u>framework: education and childcare settings</u> and <u>SEND and specialist settings: additional</u> <u>COVID-19 operational guidance</u>

The new version of <u>Keeping Children Safe in Education</u> (KCSIE) came into effect on 1 September 2021. One area that has been extensively reviewed is peer-on-peer sexual abuse in schools. Ofsted has also published an <u>updated version of Inspecting safeguarding</u> <u>in early years, education and skills</u> to align it to the latest version of KCSIE. Make sure that the KCSIE 2021 changes are reflected in your school policies and procedures and staff CPD

A new version of <u>Sexual Violence and Sexual Harassment between Children in Schools and</u> <u>Colleges</u> also came into force in September 2021

Are all your governors up-to-date with their statutory responsibilities around safeguarding? The next *Safeguarding Children* webinar takes place on **Monday 17 January 2022** (17:30-19:00) and <u>you can book your place here</u>

Ofsted has updated their <u>Education Inspection Handbooks</u> clarifying, amongst other things, how inspectors will assess how schools and colleges tackle sexual harassment, abuse and violence among children and young people. A clear line of enquiry for governing bodies will be around the RSE curriculum.
