




Acts of the Apostles 2 : 1-4

Feast day of Blessed Margaret Pole : May 28th



Margaret was the niece of two English kings and governess to Princess Mary, daughter of VIII. When she Henry opposed Henry's marriage to Anne Boleyn, the king exiled her from court, although he holiest called her "the woman in England." When her son, Cardinal Pole, denied Henry's Act of Supremacy, the king imprisoned Margaret in the Tower of London for two years and then beheaded her on May 28th 1541 without a legal trial. She was seventy.
