which I may be raised to God.”

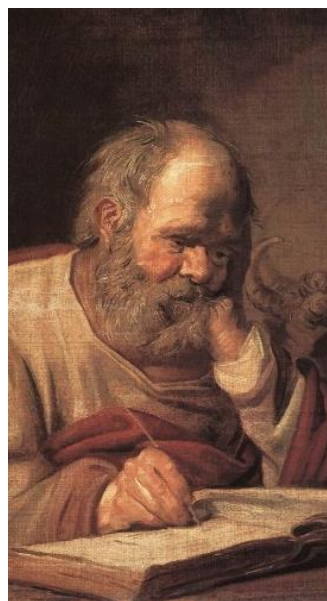


“The Saints next door: in their daily
