REQUEST FOR FACULTIES

(For the use of the Chancellor)

GRANT OF FACULTIES

The Reverend is hereby granted faculties to admit the above-named person into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church, and therefore administer the Sacraments of Initiation as appropriate.

Notes:

- 3) Baptism is to be administered only to the unbaptised; if no baptismal certificate can be found, if the certificate does not specify that the Trinitarian formula was used, or if there is another serious doubt, the person should be baptised conditionally according to the norm of the law (c. 869). Please contact the Chancery Office in any doubt.
- 4) Baptism (even conditional) and Confirmation are to be recorded in the Register of Baptism; entry is also to be made in the registers of Confirmation and Reception of Adults as appropriate.
- 5) If the candidate is married at the time of baptism, or reception, this fact is also to be noted in the appropriate register.
- 6) <u>Baptised Catholics:</u> the Chancellor does not grant the faculty to Confirm adult Catholics, this must be sought from the Bishop or Vicar General directly, please note that this will not normally be given for the Easter Vigil. Otherwise, a faculty to admit Baptised Catholics to the sacraments of initiation is only necessary if they have formally abjured the faith.
- 7) <u>Baptised children:</u> there is no ceremony for the reception of baptised children under 7, but record can be made at the time of First Holy Communion; for baptised children aged 7-14 no faculty is required, but please consult the special form for this in the liturgical books.
