Governor News – January 2022

This is a monthly summary to help governors keep up to date with key themes of national education policy, the local Diocesan context, research and good practice.

DfE has updated its <u>Covid-19 operational guidance</u> outlining the actions school leaders should take to reduce the risk of transmission of coronavirus (COVID-19) in their school

The <u>Diocesan Statement of Commitment to Racial Justice</u> has now been approved by the DBE. You may like to upload this to your school website, publicly referencing your agreement with it or create and highlight a statement of your own

There have been changes to the <u>Early Years Inspection Handbook</u> (para 101) reemphasising the focus on Communication and Language. Are you expecting the Ofsted phone call? <u>Our guidance gives tips on preparing for the meeting</u> together with a quick checklist outlining key areas to help you be ready for Ofsted

Governors who already have an access code for *Faithful Governance* will now be able to view a new course *Appointing Headteachers* (also useful for appointing deputy headteachers) as part of the Gift-ED library. Each school has been allocated at least 5 Gift-ED licences. Chairs can request access to the Gift ED library of online courses for further governors

The new RSE curriculum became statutory from September 2020 and it is important that primary and secondary governors are aware of their responsibilities under the new statutory guidance. As a result of the treatment of six-year old Arthur Labinjo-Hughes at the hands of his father and his partner the Government has launched a national review and local inspection to determine improvements needed by the agencies that came into contact with him in the months before he died. How robust are your child protection records? How do you know?

DfE are <u>seeking views on proposed changes to the statutory KCSIE Guidance</u> with a view to making changes for September 2022 – the consultation closes on **8 March 2022**.
