Your time, your money, your help?

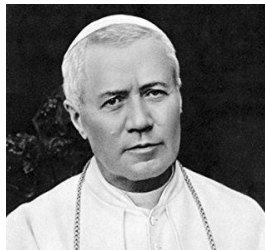

Giuseppe Sarto was born in 1835, became Pope Pius X in 1903 and was canonised a saint in 1954.

Pope Pius was devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary under the title Our Lady of Confidence. He was known for his personal poverty, and made the Vatican available to refugees from the 1908 Messina earthquake.



St Pius X is remembered in the name of one of our diocesan schools in Chelmsford.

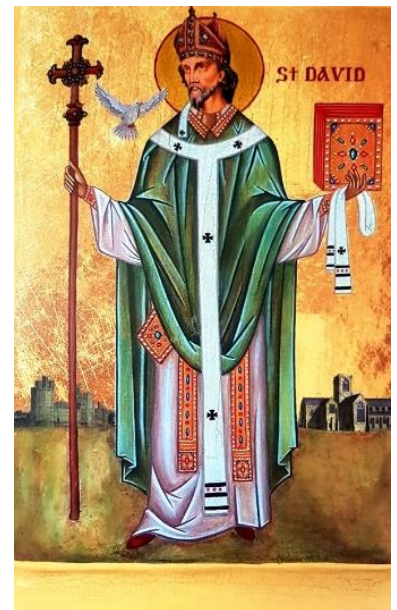
Solemnity of Saint David : 1st March
