## **Governor News - November 2022**

This is a monthly summary to help governors keep up to date with key themes of national education policy, the local Diocesan context, research and good practice.

Please note the <u>revised 2022 version of the Diocesan Protocols</u> for maintained schools and academies, setting out the principles governing the relationship between the diocese and those responsible for running Catholic schools

The new <u>School Admission Appeals Code 2022</u> has been published and came into force on 1 October 2022. <u>Updated guidance</u> for admission authorities, clerks and appeal panels, and parents and guardians has also been published - but please note that any appeal lodged on or before 30 September 2022 should use the <u>previous version of the guidance</u>

The government has updated and redeveloped guidance for schools around the <u>Prevent Duty: safeguarding learners vulnerable to radicalisation</u> together with a <u>self-assessment tool to help schools review their responsibilities under the Prevent duty</u>

The Bishops have launched a new edition of their environment document <u>The Call of Creation</u> - How 'green' is your school? How do you know? Do you discuss these issues?

An updated version of the statutory guidance on <u>school teachers' pay and conditions</u> <u>document (STPCD), for teachers</u> in England, has been published. DfE have also updated <u>guidance to help schools and governance boards develop their approach to teachers' and school leaders' pay</u>

Amanda Spielman, Her Majesty's Chief Inspector, has written about the <u>importance of</u> <u>reading – and the need to help struggling readers as they start secondary school -</u> as well as older children in primary school so they don't start behind next year
