

Blessed Miriam Teresa Demjanovich, SC (26th March 1901 - 8th May 1927) was an American Ruthenian Catholic Sister of Charity who was beatified by the Catholic Church in 2014. The beatification ceremony was the first to take place in the United States, being held in Newark, New Jersey.

She desired a religious life and after caring for her sick mother she entered the convent of the Sisters of Charity of St Elizabeth.

She wrote 24 conferences which were published as a book after her death at the age of 26.

St John Rochester

A saint and martyr from our diocese, John was the third son of John Rochester, of Terling, Essex, and Grisold Writtle of Bobbingworth. He joined the Carthusians, was a choir monk of the Charterhouse in London, and strenuously opposed the new doctrine of the royal supremacy under Henry VIII. The government had succeeded in putting down a rising in Lincolnshire, when on 13th October 1536, the far more serious Pilgrimage of Grace broke out, mustering possibly 40,000 people. One of the flashpoints had been the northern city of York, it was necessary for the government to mount a lesson in the city. The two London monks were brought from Hull to York and brought before the Lord President of the North, the Duke of Norfolk, on trumped up treason charges where they were condemned to death.
