Ofsted has released their annual report providing valuable insights into the national picture and a good guide as to where your school sits within education nationally

DfE have launched a <u>consultation on proposals to introduce minimum service levels in the</u> event of any future industrial action. The consultation closes on 30 January 2024

DfE have published a preliminary study on <u>how schools and trusts narrow attainment gaps</u> between ethnic groups

A £2million investment in Oak National Academy has been <u>announced</u> by DfE to support teachers with resources powered by artificial intelligence (AI). The investment will assist with the development of high quality curriculum resources online and create new teaching tools using AI. Over 500 respondents contributed to DfE's call for evidence on generative AI and the results have now been published

NHS England have published their <u>Mental Health of Children and Young People in England 2023 report</u>. Among the findings-one in five children and young people aged eight to 25 had a probable mental disorder in 2023
