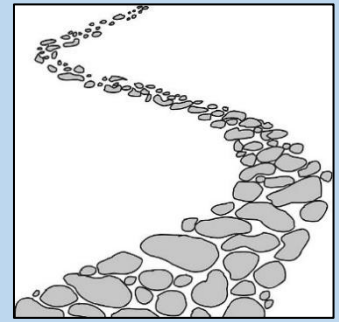

THE ITALO-ALBANIAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

One of the 23 Eastern Catholic Churches, it uses Koine Greek and Albanian in its liturgy. Nowadays, most of the congregation live in Southern Italy and Sicily. The Church also



operates in the Americas. It has 80,000 members and is led by two eparchs (bishops) and an abbot.

ST RITA OF CASCIA

Rita was a widow who joined the Augustinian order as a nun after the death of her husband. She was born in Italy in the 14th Century and was married to an Italian nobleman. She was married for eighteen years and after her husband was murdered Rita forgave his killers. She joined the order at the age of 36 and lived in prayer and piety until she died in her 70s. She was canonised in 1900 and is the patron saint of lost and impossible causes, as well as of mothers.
